

Kindle library e-books at the Winnetka-Northfield library!

Our MyMediaMall e-book service now supports a limited number of loanable Kindle books. To access them, you will need the following information:

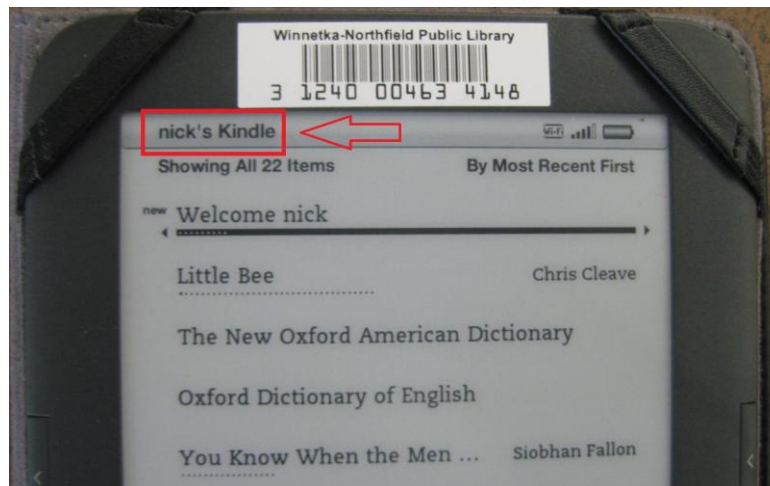
- Your library card number
- Your Amazon.com account login and password

This guide covers transfer to a Kindle. It is also possible to read Kindle books on a PC, Mac, iPad, and a variety of portable devices - for more information, visit:

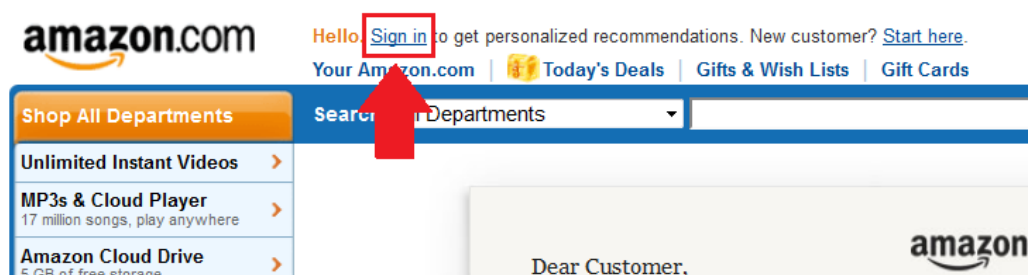

Please note: Amazon keeps a record of what you download through this service, and may use that information for its purposes. The library cannot enforce its privacy policy on Amazon's end.

1. Note the device name of your Kindle, as circled in the picture below.



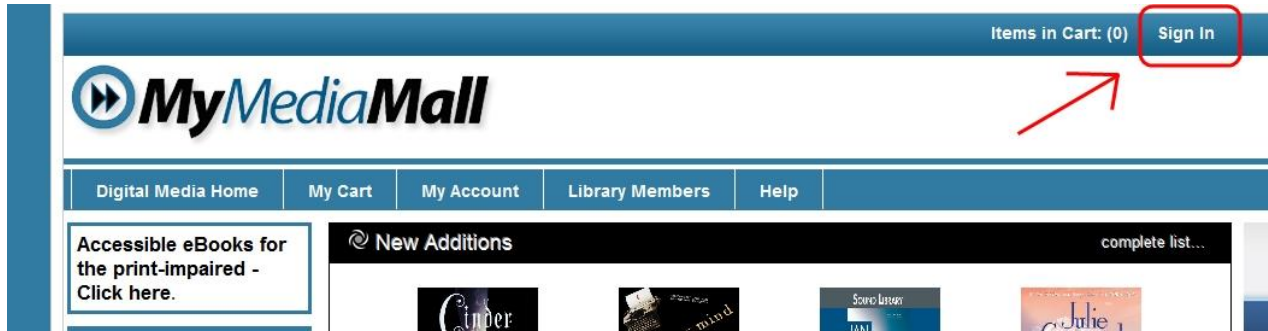
2. On a computer, go to www.amazon.com and log in using the account information you have registered with your Kindle.



3. Once you are logged in to Amazon, go to our e-book database:

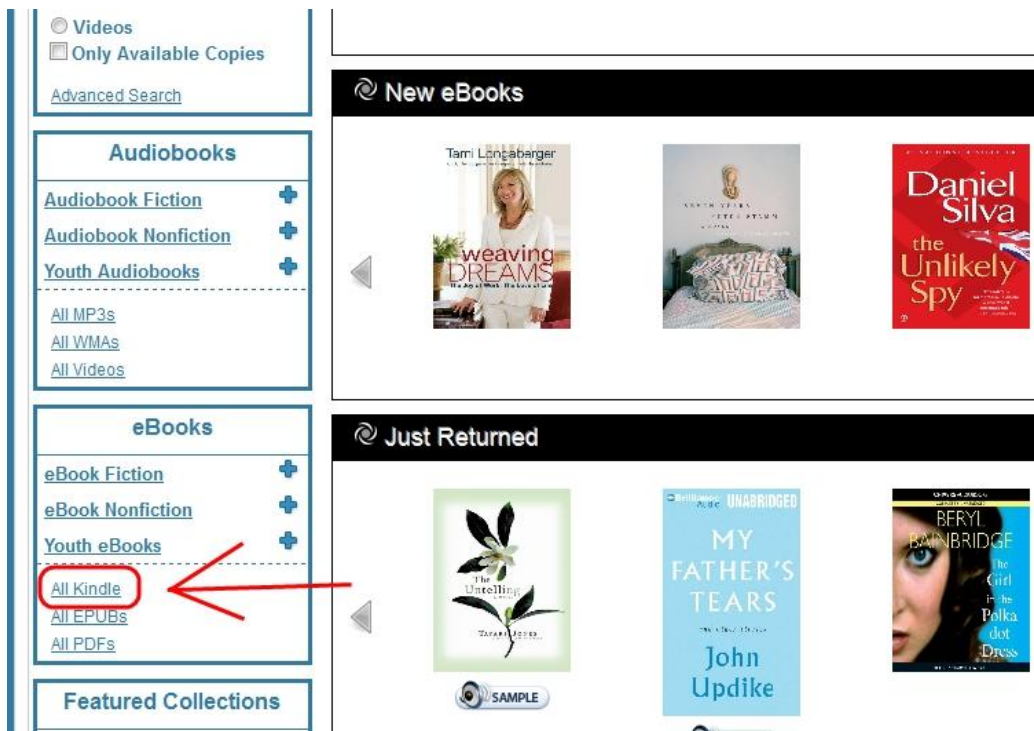
Hit the sign in button:



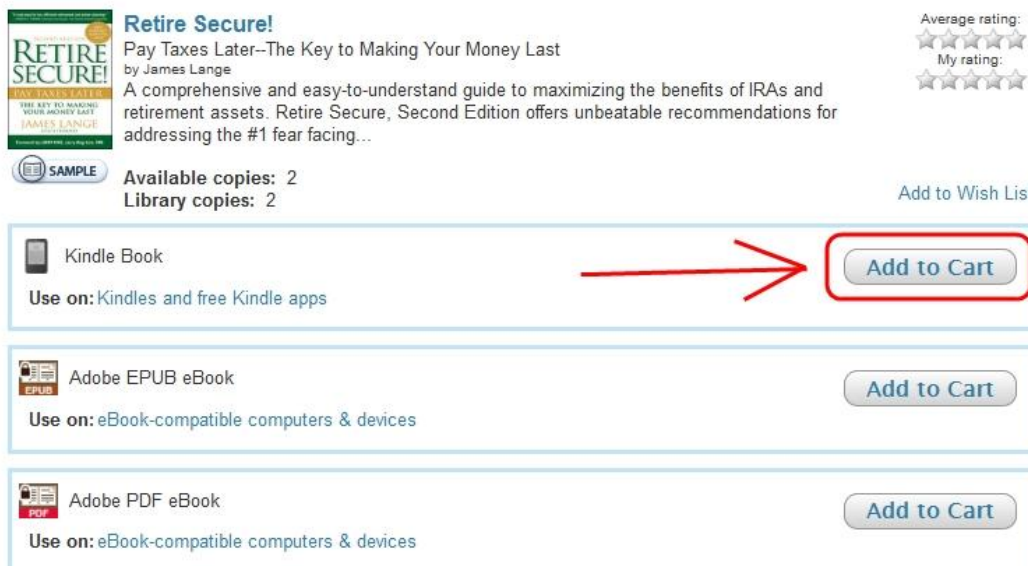
4. Choose Winnetka from the dropdown menu; afterwards you will see a prompt to enter in your library card number.



5. Once logged in, you can browse our selection. One way to access the Kindle book collection is to scroll down the page, and look for the ‘eBooks’ heading on the bar to the left. Click on the ‘All Kindle’ link underneath.



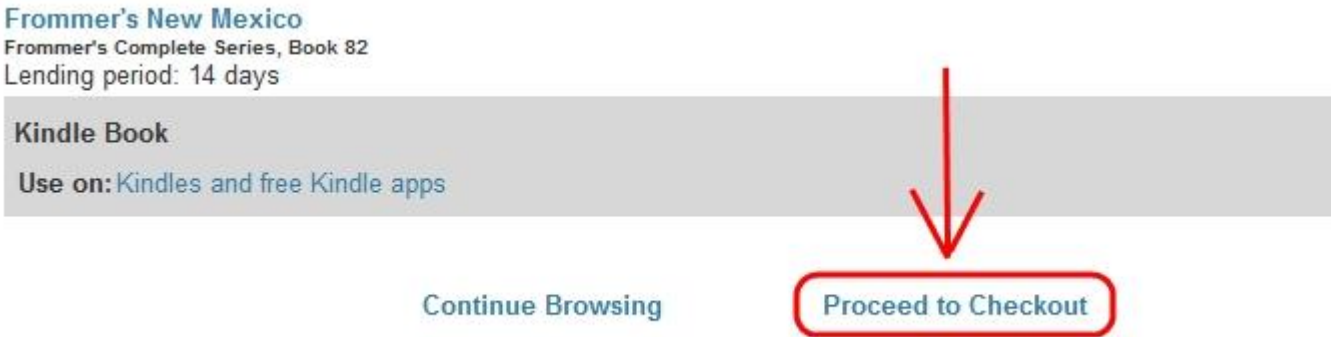
6. Next to each Kindle book, you will see one of two phrases: ‘Add to cart’, which means the book is currently available for download, or ‘Place a hold’, which means you will be put on a wait list for it.



A few notes:

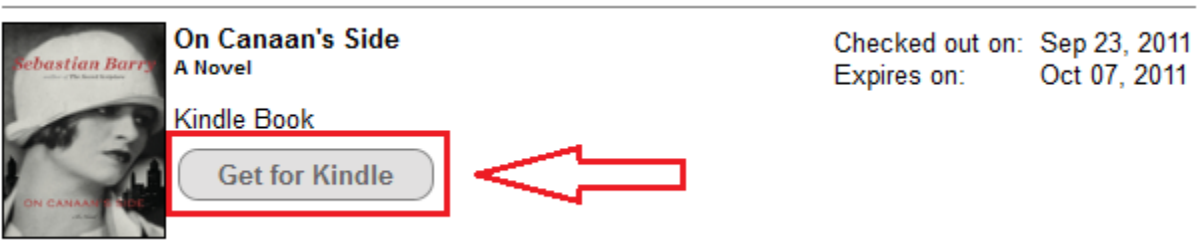
- This service is very popular, so big-name titles may have a wait list. Be sure that you are logged in to see availability on our Winnetka-only copies.
- The number of holds you see displayed for a title is often inaccurate, for technical reasons we won't bore you with here. Do not be alarmed if a title shows dozens of holds.

7. To either place a hold or check the book out, click “**Proceed to Checkout**” and then “**Confirm checkout**” on the following screen.



8. If you placed a hold, you will be asked to enter your email address – you will be emailed when your copy becomes available.

Once you have checked out an available book, you will be presented with a “**Get for Kindle**” button. Click on that and you will be directed back to Amazon.



9. The Amazon page should show a “**Get library book**” button to the right. The dropdown menu underneath lets you choose how you want to transfer it, and to which device. Make sure it is displaying the name of your Kindle, as determined in step 1.

- Public library books require an active Wi-Fi connection for wireless delivery to a Kindle device. Library books will not be delivered via your Kindle's 3G connection.
- Kindle automatically backs up all of your notes and highlights. If you choose to purchase the book at a later date from the Kindle Store or check it out again, all your notes and highlights will be preserved.

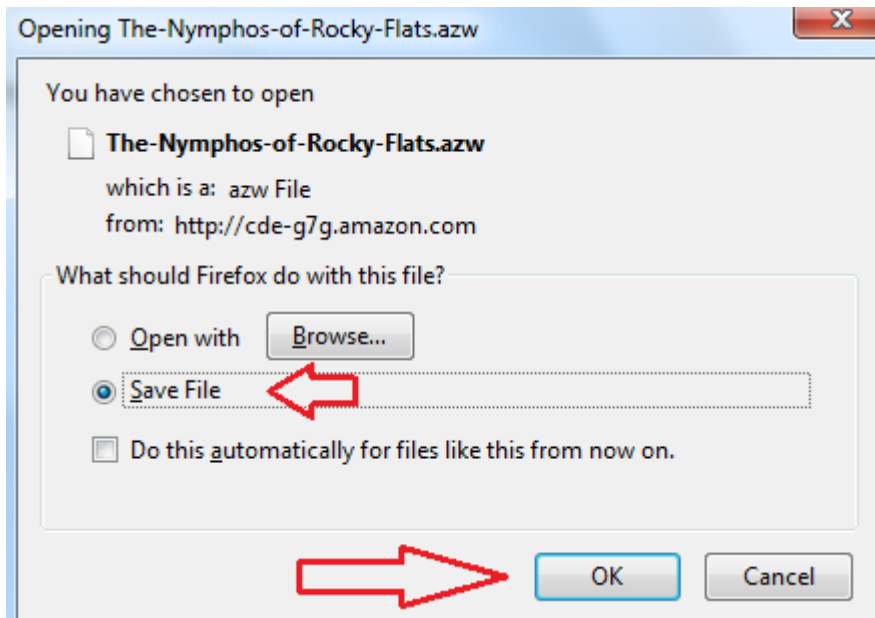
At this point the process can differ:

- If you have a Kindle 3 with wireless support, a Kindle Fire, or other **wi-fi enabled** Kindle, then the book will transfer automatically, and will be usable just like a regular Kindle book. You're finished!
 - ...unless your book was published by Penguin. As of February 2012, books published by Penguin Group (including imprints) can no longer be synced wirelessly, and must be manually transferred as detailed below.
- If you have a Kindle 1, 2, or DX, or other Kindle with **only 3G** support, then you will need to transfer the book via wired connection, as detailed on the following pages. Amazon does not allow library book transfer over 3G.

10. To begin wired transfer, hit the yellow 'Download now' button that appears after you click 'Get library book' in step 9 above.



11. You will be prompted to save the file. Do so. It will save to the download location set in your browser.

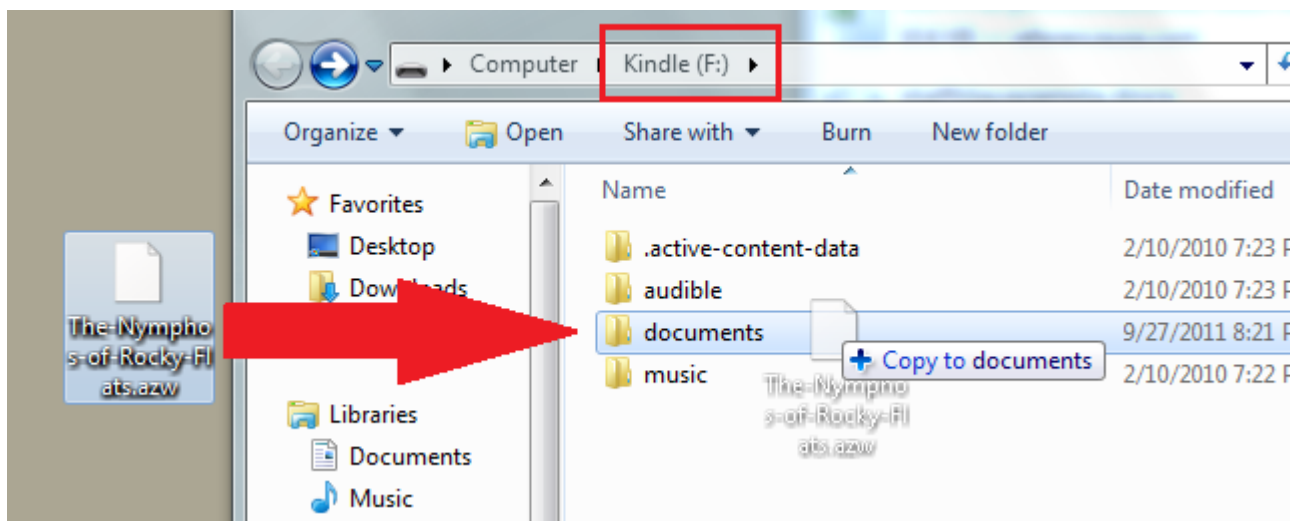


If you do not know where the file is saved, you can search your computer for "azw" to find any e-book file in the kindle format.

12. Attach your Kindle via USB, and open the drive on your computer.



13. Now you just need to transfer the downloaded file to the “documents” folder of your Kindle, either by cutting and pasting or clicking and dragging.



Safely detach your Kindle by ejecting it, and **you're finished!**
